Instructions

Teachers:

Print out this document. Pages 1-8 will be the categories on which your class will work together to place the objects. Cut out the objects on pages 9-12 to be sorted. Page 13 has blank squares for the teacher or the students to add their own objects. Some objects are more difficult than others, and some may be placed in multiple categories to add an extra challenge.

Students:

Cut out the objects on pages 9-12, and then sort them onto the material pages (pages 1-8) by what they are made of. For example, a book is made of paper, so it will go in the paper category. Once you are done, make your own objects in the blank squares (page 13), and sort them, too!
