


Gas and liquids are FLUIDS


 Definition: A substance that has no fixed shape and yields easily to external pressure; a gas or a liquid.

 Convection can happen BECAUSE fluids have these properties.




The Global Conveyor Belt:

Convection in our Oceans






Cold Water sinks in the North Atlantic

- Cold water is pushed up
 - Very nutrient rich that is why sea life around Vancouver Island (for example) is so rich.
- Heated by the Sun, it becomes lighter and flows along the surface.
